Year 1 Reading

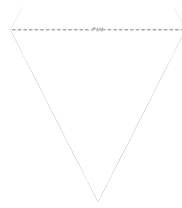
Lots of people are planning to hold a socially distancing street/ garden party this Friday to celebrate the 75th anniversary of Victory in Europe Day.
